Possibility of an after school STEM class. Blended learning model is getting pushed from the district. Almost all teachers at Cook are planning to use stations rotations model 25%-35% of the time.
 - **b)** Feedback from this year of Community Council and suggestions for next year. Would be nice to not change original calendar dates for meetings. Liked being able to discuss data and trust land funds more since we didn't organize a fundraiser.
 - c) We will have Think Through Math next year for grades 3-6. We did not get our Ascend Math K-2 licenses so the district is possibly getting us an alternative. We might pilot a program but it would be free.
